OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- School navy waterproof cagoule for school outings and Wellington boots.
- School bag/rucksack – plain navy, black or brown (not executive cases) – we recommend the school rucksack for Juniors.
- Pocket comb and plain navy, black or brown ribbons, slides or bands (as available in Uniform Shop, no glitter!).
- Years 4, 5 and 6 will be asked to buy a few items to aid their studies (e.g.). a dictionary, a thesaurus, a calculator, a mathematics set. Staff will discuss recommendations with their forms.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Jewellery may **not** be worn with the exception of confirmation crosses and genuine Medicaid bracelets etc. Only plain studs or sleepers may be worn in pierced ears - only one in each ear! All earrings must be removed for P.E lessons. We do not advise children in the infant classes to wear any ear studs.
- If below collar length, hair **MUST** be worn tied back.

NAMING OF UNIFORM

All clothing worn at or brought to school should be clearly marked with nametags. Plimsolls and shoes must be marked using a permanent marker pen.

Overalls – name to be clearly marked or embroidered in yellow on right hand side of chest – full name if possible.

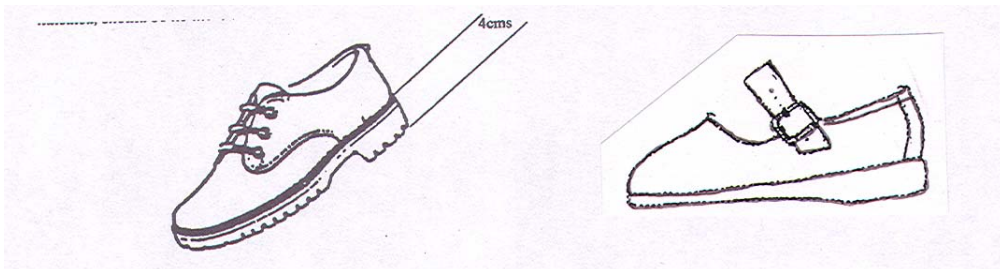
School bags, shoe bags, pencil cases, ink pens, etc should all be named as clearly as possible. Only by naming all these things can we keep our 'Lost Property' basket empty! Your help in this matter is very much appreciated.

SKIRT LENGTH

For reasons of safety it is important that the girls wear School kilts of a sensible length (ie. at or just below the knee). Games' skirts should be mid-thigh length.

SHOES

For health and safety reasons we expect all the girls to wear shoes which conform to the uniform code. Girls may NOT wear slip-on shoes, shoes with open heels/toes or shoes with heels or patent leather shoes. On occasions when we have an 'Own Clothes Day' for charity, girls must come to school in suitable shoes – high heels are not safe.



Parents have often asked us for sources of suitable shoes. We offer the following range of examples with details of the width fittings and sizes and trust that it provides a useful guide as to the style of shoe we require for our uniform. If you have any doubt, please do contact the School for advice.

Shoes should offer sufficient support for the foot and be robust enough to be worn 5 days a week. Note – high fashion shoes are rarely suitable, if in doubt seek clarification from school eg. the current ballet pump style is not suitable.
