SENIOR SCHOOL

Only official school uniform is to be worn and these items are only available from the Uniform Shop unless otherwise specified.

WINTER UNIFORM

School navy raincoat OR navy overcoat OR waterproof cagoule

School navy blazer

School navy kilt (sensible length ie. at or just below the knee)

School navy blue pullover

School blue striped blouse

School navy 'turn over top' short socks or 70 denier navy tights

Black shoes* (heel limit is 4cms) please see diagram on following page

School scarf for Years 7 – 9 (Years 10/11 may wear plain navy scarf*)

School dark blue overall for Science/Art (name to be embroidered in yellow – see below for details)

SUMMER UNIFORM (this can be worn between the start of the Summer Term and the October half term)

Years 7 & 8: School blue striped short sleeve blouse
School navy kilt (sensible length ie. at or just below the knee)
School navy blue pullover
School navy 'turn over top' short socks or neutral tights
Black shoes*

Years 9 – 11: As above and School navy 'turn over top' short socks or navy/
neutral tights

GAMES UNIFORM

School navy games skirt (mid-thigh length) and top

School navy games socks – winter

School white games socks – summer

Plain navy tracksuit trousers

Navy 'hoodie' School sweatshirt – up to Year 11

Games bag

Predominately white trainers*

Tennis racquet*

Tennis whites – **teams only**

GAMES UNIFORM (continued)

Football boots *

Hockey shin pads

Hockey stick*

Navy 'hoodie' School sweatshirt – **Sixth Form only**

Navy cycling shorts –for volleyball/athletics

** Not available in Uniform Shop*

OTHER REQUIREMENTS

Schoolbook bag - plain brown, black or navy; of strong waterproof material and large enough to hold books and files.

Maths equipment -a good geometry set which **must** contain set square, protractor, pie chart scale and compasses. A 30cm ruler and a scientific calculator – preferably Sharp EL-531WB. The calculator and pie chart scale can be purchased from the Uniform Shop at competitive prices.

Navy hair ribbons, brown slides, bands, plain Kirby grips.

Girls who sing in the Lower School Choir (Years 7 – 9) wear school uniform.

Girls who sing in the Senior School choir require: $\frac{3}{4}$ length black skirt and white blouse.
Black tights and black shoes
(NOT BOOTS)

Girls who play in the Orchestra (or any musical Ensemble) require: White long sleeved blouse
 $\frac{3}{4}$ length black skirt
Black tights and black shoes
(NOT BOOTS)

NAMING OF UNIFORM

All clothing worn or brought to school should be clearly marked with nametags. In order to avoid indiscriminate borrowing, we ask for parents' co-operation by marking items of clothing and footwear with name in **BLOCK CAPITALS**.

Position: **Science Overalls** – name to be clearly marked or embroidered in YELLOW on right hand side of chest – full name if possible – a minimum of one initial and surname.
Games Skirt – initials in PALE BLUE at the bottom left hand side of skirt.
Gym shoes – initials on the outside edge.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Years 7 – 11

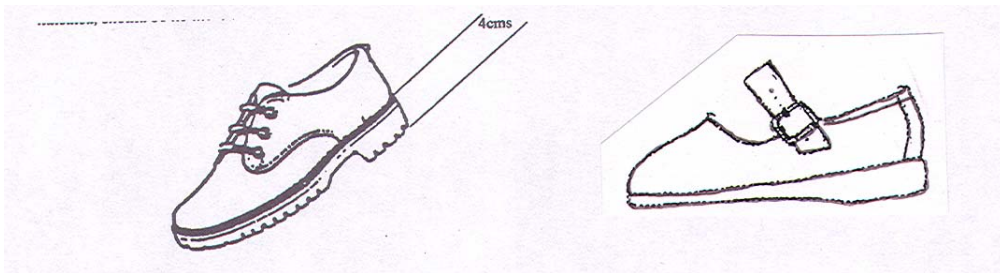
Jewellery may **not** be worn by any year group with the exception of confirmation crosses and genuine Medicaid bracelets. Only plain studs or sleepers may be worn in pierced ears (only one in each ear!).

Body piercing other than pierced ears is not acceptable.

If below collar length, hair **MUST** be worn tied back with a **navy** hair ribbon or scrunchy.

SHOE INFORMATION

For health and safety reasons we expect all the girls to wear shoes which conform to the uniform code. Girls may NOT wear flimsy slip-on shoes, shoes with open heels/toes or shoes with 'high heels' or patent leather shoes.



Parents have often asked us for sources of suitable shoes. We offer the following range of examples with details of the width fittings and sizes and trust that it provides a useful guide as to the style of shoe we require for our uniform. If you have any doubt, please do contact the School for advice.

Shoes should offer sufficient support for the foot and be robust enough to be worn 5 days a week.

Note – high fashion shoes are rarely suitable, if in doubt seek clarification from school eg. the current ballet pump style is not suitable.
